Each of our camping programs offers the opportunity to participate in new activities, maybe for the first time, in a fun and safe environment. Camping activities fulfill a cub scout's dreams of fun, excitement and adventure. They provide a natural setting to be a part of the magic of scouting in the great outdoors. We have outlined the different opportunities in this packet. Our camps programs are rank appropriate for your boys. Leaders, use your resources to help at camp!

Did you know you do not have to be a leader to come to camp? Any adult can act as an Akela at camp. **You don't even have to come every day**, but we're sure you will want to. Camping is a great way to spend quality time with your son. You don't need to know anything about camping. Our trained and dedicated staff will be there to assist you every step of the way. Our staff will have programs all day and most evenings for you and your scout to enjoy. Think of it as a family vacation in the woods that you don't have to plan! We offer great adventures for scouts and adults alike. Want to be a kid again? Come to camp just for the adventure!

What will we do at camp?

The camp you select will determine what you do, but the basics are the same. We offer handicrafts, nature study, archery, BB guns, field sports, boating and fishing, and swimming. Our field sports program will have an emphasis on soccer where all participants will learn the basics and some advanced playing techniques. Each boy can earn the sports belt loop for soccer, archery and BB guns.

Webelos resident camps will also offer special programs for Webelos to learn some more advanced scouting skills to help prepare them to become boy scouts. While at camp, Webelos will also fulfill many of the Webelos outdoor requirements and electives. When scouts are at resident camp they will get as much program as they would get in 62 den meetings. That's right, 62!!

Our Cub Scout camping programs are continuing to improve and 2008 looks to be even better than previous years! We have taken suggestions from parents, leaders and scouts to create a new and unique Cub Scout camping experience. This year our Theme will be "The Land where Dinosaurs roam." Our cub's scouts will be going on a prehistoric journey where the T Rex was king and the cavemen ran scared. Every boy will be guaranteed to have fun.



Cub Scout Day Camp

Day camps are recommended for younger cub scouts, but all cubs will enjoy the activities. Day camp is a community-based daytime camp designed to bring the camping environment to the boys local community. Cubs get to experience a variety of activities over the four days, such as crafts, games, BB guns and archery, swimming, nature, and much more. On the last day we will enjoy a family picnic. Day campers need to bring a lunch each day. Hours of operation are usually 8:30 am to 3 pm. After registering for day camp, directors will follow-up with more information about specific camp details.

Day camp is a wonderful, cost effective alternative to day care. The 2008 day camp theme is "The Land where Dinosaurs roam." Our cub's scouts will be going on a prehistoric journey where the T – Rex was king and the cavemen ran scared.

Parent & Pal Family Camp

Parent & Pal Family Camp is an ideal camping experience at one of our two scout camps for cub scouts of any age and a parent or guardian. Parent / Pal camp is an overnight camping experience involving many Cub Scout *families*. Our council provides all of the elements of the outdoor experience of summer camp, such as a trained staff, meals, tents, and program.

This program gives the cub and his family, the opportunity to experience quality time with the Cub Scout camping program as a backdrop. The program schedule is loose so that parent and cub teams can pick and choose the program areas they wish to visit.

Resident Camp

Our Council operates two fully accredited resident camps. Camp Merz located on Chautauqua Lake near Mayville, NY and Elk Lick Scout Reserve near Smethport, PA.

Cub Scout Resident Camps (four day and three night) allow boys to experience the outdoors in a fun and safe environment. Cubs get to participate in many different areas of adventure, such as swimming, boating, archery, BB gun, crafts, and sports which include soccer and volleyball and much more. Cubs work on age appropriate programs run by trained staff. They stay in tents and sleep on cots, and have nutritious meals provided in the dining hall during there stay.

Webelos resident camp is an excellent way to prepare Webelos for the journey to become a Boy Scout and building teamwork. Boys will be staying in tents and experiencing all that the camps have to offer. Activity areas like archery, boating, swimming, scout skills; sports include soccer and volleyball, handicrafts and shooting sports will help the Webelos Scout earn many activity pins.

Pre Camp Leaders Meeting and Parent Orientation

There will be a pre camp leaders meetings on **Thursday, May 8TH & Saturday, May 10th** to give **leaders and parents** a chance to find out more information about our camp programs, take a tour of the camp and review important information to make your stay at camp a comfortable and enjoyable experience.

Boys and adults under age 40 staying 72 hours or less or attending Day Camp need a "Class 1" Medical Form (Health History) updated in the last 12 months.

Boys and adults under age 40 staying more than 72 hours need a "Class 1 & Class 2" Medical Forms (both Health History, updated in the last 12 months and Medical Exam updated in the past 36 months) Note: A medical exam is good for 3 years

Adults over age 40 need a "Class 3" Medical Form (both Health History, and Medical Exam **updated in the last 12 months**) regardless of the time spent in camp

Note: By attending camp you are authorizing the Allegheny Highlands Council the right to use your image in any photographs or videos taken at camp for promotional purposes.

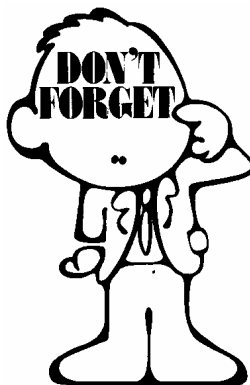
