The Allegheny Highlands Council offers 6-day Resident Camping programs for Boy Scouts at its two camping facilities to provide the optimum in Outdoor experience. There are central dining facilities and warm water showers. There is a Trading Post with BSA supplies, souvenirs, snacks, and other items that can be purchased. In addition both camps are staffed with well-trained and enthusiastic staff.

The Allegheny Highlands Council operates two Distinctively different summer camps. At Camp Merz, we have the waters of Chautauqua Lake as a backdrop, where scouts and scouters can enjoy swimming, sailing, kayaking, and water-skiing just to mention a few. We also have the scenic views along the Portage Trail, as well as many other attractions around the Chautauqua Region. Also at Camp Merz, we offer skeet shooting in addition to 22's and black powder on our modern range. At Elk Lick Scout Reserve, we have 985 acres of beautiful wooded property, where scouts can enjoy nature at its best. We also have a new climbing and rappelling tower for scouts to learn and experience the basics of climbing. Elk Lick offers mountain biking and mountain-boarding programs to explore the backcountry trails. With beautiful trails all throughout the property, Elk Lick has for your scouts, great opportunities for a great outpost experience.

Elk Lick Scout Reserve, near Smethport, PA. lies nestled in the foothills of the Allegheny mountains. Situated on 985 acres of hardwood forest the camp is a virtual paradise for hiking, mountain biking and camping. The reserve has a modern swimming pool. There is boating and canoeing done on the small lake that is in the center of the main area of camp.

Some Scouts Can't Attend with your Troop? That's OK!

Provisional camping is a program for those scouts who would like to attend camp regardless if their own Troop is attending or not. These scouts will either form a provisional troop and a provisional scoutmaster and assistant will be assigned to them or be assigned to another troop that has adequate leadership. If the scouts are returning for an extra week at the **"Twice as Nice Price"** from either of our two great camps they will be provisional their second week. That's right a scout may attend one week with his troop at one camp and then attend our other camp for half price as a provisional camper. This is a great way to try out both of our great camps!



What Will My Boys Do at Camp?

In addition to working on Merit Badges, our camps offer a wide variety of troop, patrol and individual activities to make your week an adventure you will not soon forget. You will have options like troop swims, patrol shoots, patrol vs. patrol competitions. Various hikes and treks will be offered along with in camp and out of camp outposts. You may want to take advantage of our beautiful surrounding on an individual basis with your buddy through activities like twilight fishing, walking our nature trails or watching the wildlife around camp. Early bird programs will be offered on a daily basis for those who like to rise and shine early.

Pre Camp Leaders Meeting and Parent Orientation

There will be pre-camp leaders meeting on May 9th and May 14th at both camps to give leaders a chance to get up to date information about camp programs, look at schedules, and review important information to make your stay at camp a comfortable and enjoyable experience. If your unit does not send a representative to this meeting, you may miss out on valuable information.

Resident Camp Leadership

The preferred method of camping in the BSA is that the individual Boy Scout Troop camp under its own leadership. It is BSA policy that 2 adults must attend on every Troop activity. The Allegheny Highlands Council does not charge for the first leader, additional free leaders are based on 1:8 adults to youth ratio (see chart on adult leader camp application). Additional leaders are welcome to attend at a cost of \$60 for the week; those additional leaders who will only be at camp for a portion of the week are asked to pay for their meals: \$4 breakfast, \$5 lunch, and \$6 for supper. (Leadership may rotate during the week.) At least one of the two adults attending with the Boy Scouts must be a registered member of the BSA. All adults attending camp are required to complete the BSA's *Youth Protection Training* program, which is offered at camp.

How to Register for Camp:

All the necessary forms are in this packet.

1. Determine when the Troop will be going to camp. Once this has been done, complete the Hold A Space Form and send it with a \$50 site deposit to: **Allegheny Highlands Council, PO Box 261, Falconer NY 14733-0261**; your cancelled check is your receipt. Allegheny Highlands Council Units can charge their unit account. For units that do not meet the minimum or exceed the maximum capacities of the site, the camp reserves the right to move you to a different site and/or ask you to share a site with another troop.
2. Have you Scouts and leaders fill out the individual registration forms and mail them in all together to the Scout Service Center. Fill out the unit roster for your information; we will confirm your reservation prior to your arrival at camp. For scouts who would like to attend camp an additional week as a provisional there is a **“twice is nice”** at a discount for the second week.
3. At **both camps**: have all your leaders and scouts fill out the appropriate medical form and **bring to camp for check in**.
4. If more applications or medical forms are needed you may duplicate or download additional forms that will be available on our web pages at www.alleghenyhighlands.org, www.elklick.org, www.campmerz.org, or request more forms to be mailed to you.

Provisional Camping

Provisional camping is a program for those scouts who would like to attend camp without adult leadership. Scouts will either be assigned a unit to camp with or will make up a provisional unit with the camp providing the adults. For an extra week at the **“Twice as Nice”** price those scouts who attend without leadership will be considered provisional.

Medical Forms

All Scouts under 18 must turn in the medication permission form, which must be signed by a doctor, and turned in with the medical form. This includes permission to treat for minor headaches, colds, cuts, scratched, etc. by our camp health officer.

Boys and adults under age 40 staying 72 hours or more need a “Class 1 & Class 2” Medical Forms (both Health History, updated in the last 12 months and Medical Exam updated in the 36 months) Note: A medical exam is good for 3 years, however the information and signature of the parent or guardian must be updated annually.

Adults over age 40 need a “Class 3” Medical Form (both Health History, and Medical Exam updated in the last 12 months) regardless of the time spent in camp.

Financial Assistance / Camperships

Our council raises funds annually, through local sources to help scouts attend summer camp. A limited amount of financial assistance is available for all Scouts registered in the Allegheny Highlands Council, based on financial need. It is expected that both the Scout’s family and his Troop will contribute toward his camp fee. The Council only grants partial camperships in order to help as many youth as possible. This is what our campership donors expect.

If applying for campership assistance, please send your Campership Application (that is enclosed) by Monday, May 1st to the council service center **Allegheny Highlands Council, PO Box 261, Falconer, NY 14733-0261**. Balance of payments can be made with cash, Visa, MasterCard, or American Express. Applicants are reviewed by our committee the first week in May and leaders are notified by May 15th.

Refund Policy: *All Camp Fees are refundable and are subject to a \$25.00 handling fee per scout. A written request providing a legitimate reason must be received by the Scout Service Center no later than **September 1, 2009**. Refunds will only be made to the person who paid the fees. Legitimate reasons include summer school, medical excuse, or death in the family.*

Pre-Camp Meetings

Pre-camp meetings are held on May 9th at 10am and May 14th at 6:30pm at camp. It is VERY important that a representative of your troop attend one of these meetings. Program materials, schedules, etc will be distributed.

Check In / Out

Check in time is 2pm on Sunday. Early arrival is possible if arrangements are made in advance. Check out is after the closing meal on Friday. Troops may stay over Friday night at no charge. Breakfast consisting of Cereal, milk and fruit can be provided for a nominal fee if arranged in advance.

Accommodations

Each campsite has tents on platforms with metal spring cots. We will do our best to provide mattresses for leaders, but we cannot guarantee that there will be enough. We do not provide mattresses for Scouts. Each troop will be assigned one picnic table and one dining fly. Each site also has a latrine building and running water. There are central shower facilities at the center of camp and at the pool house.

Additional Fees

Some programs require the scouts to purchase additional materials or tickets from our trading post. Shotgun, Leather Working, Basketry, Woodcarving Merit Badges, and Older Scout Program are some of the classes that require additional materials. Details will be given at the pre-camp meetings.

In-site Cooking

Your troop will be preparing one dinner in your site. Please be prepared with the proper cooking utensils, etc. Staff members will join you at these meals to assist.

Merit Badge pre-requisites and partials

If a scout has done pre-requisites, they must show proof. If they do not have proof, then they will get a partial.



Scoutmaster's Favorite

Each week Scoutmasters will be asked if they wish to teach a Merit Badge that they specialize in. If it is one we already offer we ask for your expertise. If it is not a merit badge we offer we will work a schedule out that is convenient to you.

Camp Projects

If you would like to do a camp service project, please let the ranger know upon your check in or in advance if possible. If you have access to materials and know that we do not have them you can bring the materials needed to get your project started. 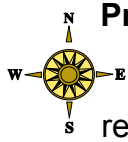

FEATURES AT ELK LICK SCOUT RESERVE:

Polaris Program - First Year Camper

Program. During the course of the week, the Scout will have the opportunity to complete nearly all of the outdoor requirements for Tenderfoot, Second Class and First Class. The Polaris program is scheduled as to allow scouts to work on one or two merit badges. Scouts should have records of previous requirements accomplished when coming to camp.



Older Scout Adventure!



This program starts the week with Extreme Mountain boarding, then Whitewater rafting the lower Youghiogheny River and whitewater Merit Badge. On Thursday we break out

the Extreme Mountain bikes and head out on our own Jeep Jamboree trails and then a special feast only for our older scouts with time to reflect upon their week. This adventure will lead to both on and off camp experiences. There will be an additional fee of **\$50.00** for this program. **Limited spaces available each week and Canoeing merit badge is required.**

Outposts allow Scouts to take an overnight or daylong excursion to remote areas of the camp property or even off camp property! Some are required for Merit Badges. Outposts are open to every Scout. These outposts are the highlight of the week at camp providing some of the most exciting experiences that a boy could dream. Outposts will be on Thursday nights for 1) Wilderness Survival, 2) Backpacking & Hiking 3) Cycling 4) Climbing 5) Canoeing merit badges, and 6) Polaris 7) Archery outpost where scouts will get a chance to shoot on a 3D Field Course. We will again offer for the Night Owls, an Ecology outpost to experience the outdoors from our nocturnal friends prospective. Scouts taking these merit badges will get preference but any scout or scouter is welcome to participate.

Black Powder Shooting is an exciting experience. A puff of smoke and the loud crack of a black powder rifle stir thoughts of adventure in the outdoors of days gone by. There will be an additional fee of **\$7.50 per 15 shots** for Shotgun shooting.

Scouts will face the challenge of our NEW climbing/rappelling tower as they climb one side and rappel down the other! After having adequate training they are able to move on to

the rock faces right on the camp property.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT CAMP MERZ

Pre-Camp Meetings

Pre-camp meetings are held on May 9th at 10am and May 14th at 6:30pm at camp. It is VERY important that a representative of your troop attend one of these meetings. Program materials, schedules, etc will be distributed.

Check In / Out

Check in time is 2pm on Sunday. Early arrival is possible if arrangements are made in advance. Check out is after the closing campfire on Friday. Troops may stay over Friday night at no charge. Breakfast consisting of Cereal, milk and fruit can be provided for a nominal fee if arranged in advance.

Accommodations

Each campsite has tents on platforms with metal spring cots. We will do our best to provide mattresses for leaders, but we cannot guarantee that there will be enough. **We do not provide mattresses for Scouts.** Each site also has one picnic table and one dining fly. Each site also has a latrine building and running water. There are youth shower facilities at the Public Shower House and the Waterfront Building. Adult showers are located in the Dawson Training Center along with the leaders lounge.

Additional Fees

Some programs require the scouts to purchase additional materials or tickets. Water Skiing, Motor boating, Shotgun, Space Exploration, Leather Working, Basketry, Electronics, and Chemistry are some of the classes that require additional materials. Details will be given at the pre-camp meetings.

In-site Cooking

Your troop will be preparing two dinners and one lunch in your site. Please be prepared with the proper cooking utensils, etc. Staff members will join you at these meals to assist. There will also be a dessert competition so come prepared with your choice of dessert.

Merit Badge pre-requisites and partials

If a scout has done pre-requisites, they must show proof of what they have done. If they do not have proof, then they will get a partial. Please bring the projects or papers if available, also a note from the Scout Master is acceptable.

Age & Rank Restrictions

We have set age and rank limitations for various classes and programs. We base these limitations on state regulations, the scout's safety, and size restrictions. We cannot make exceptions to these limits.



Leader Programs

Camp Merz provides a variety of leader activities during the week such as training, the Scoutmaster Merit Badge, and Staff vs. Leader events. Leaders are also encouraged to help teach classes and do camp projects. If you would like to do a camp project, please contact us in advance if possible so we can be sure to have any materials you may need.

NIMAWANACHEN - First Year Camper Program

During the course of the week, the Scout will have the opportunity to complete nearly all of the outdoor requirements for Tenderfoot, Second Class and First Class. The NIMAWANACHEN participants will sign up for morning or afternoon sessions allowing them a half-day to work on merit badges.

Shooting Sports Complex designed to allow Scouts and Scouters the opportunity to shoot 22's, shotguns and black powder all at one great location. Our new BB range will be open for 11 year olds only during scheduled times. There will be an additional fee of **\$7.50 per 15 shots** for Shotgun shooting.

Outpost Camps allow Scouts to take an overnight excursion to remote areas of the camp property or even off camp property! Some are required for Merit Badges and they are all fun and open to every Scout. These outposts are the highlight of the week at camp providing some of the most exciting experiences that a boy could dream of. Outposts will be on Tuesday nights for Wilderness Survival and Camping merit badges, Nimawanachen participants, Aquatics, and Older Scout Program. All outposts are subject to the availability of staff and supplies. Aquatics outpost has a minimum age of 14 and the Older Scout outpost is for the scouts in the older scout program 15 years of age or older.

Older Scout Program

Biking; Hiking; Swimming; Kayaking; Bouldering; Sound like fun! For 2009 there is an improved program for scouts 15 years and older, we are enhancing our program that will involve activities for the older scouts looking for a little more out of their summer camp experience. Not only can you spend your mornings earning merit badges you can spend your afternoon and some evenings having fun, for more information check out www.campmerz.org.

Sailing, Motor boating and Waterskiing allow scouts to utilize the beautiful Chautauqua Lake to gain experience and learn a great summertime activity. There will be an additional **\$25.00 fee** per Scout taking motor boating or water skiing merit badges, due to fuel costs; because of availability each class is limited to 6 scouts.
