Happy New Year! Time just flies, and we need to keep pace to make sure our council, and our camps provide all the necessary things you need to make scouting great for every one of our scouts.

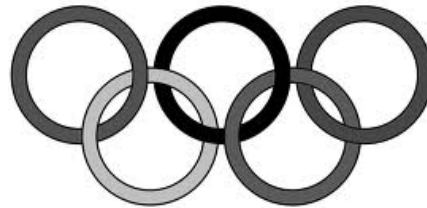
Speaking of camp, we continue to make improvements, and more are on the way for this year! You have seen it year after year, and this year will be no different!

Every Scoutmaster will receive a copy of our new merit badge counselor list, which we must now reprint every year, at the January Roundtable. Because of new Youth Protection & registration requirements, we must reregister counselors every year, just like your Troop recharterers every year. The side benefit is that it will always be up to date! Thank you for bearing with us as we institute new National requirements.



### Annual Bowl A Thon

It's that time of year! Make your plans now for this fun event that our scouts enjoy every year! We will have the kickoff at the District January Roundtables on January 12<sup>th</sup>, with bowling dates starting February 20 and going through March 5<sup>th</sup>. Our District Executives will work with you and the local alleys to make the date you bowl fit your schedule. Please contact Todd or Wayne as soon as possible to schedule your unit to participate. There is a sign up sheet in this Highlander, which we ask you to fill out and get to the Service Center as soon as possible. The Annual Bowlathon is a great way for your unit to have a lot of fun and earn some funds. You will need to schedule your bowling time and date with Wayne & Todd. They will make the payment and contract arrangements with the local bowling lanes. Please review all of the information in the packet, which will be sent to all unit leaders that are signed up if you miss the kickoff. The rules for the Bowlathon are explained on the pledge form. Participants must raise at least \$25 in pledges to earn a patch and free bowling, \$50 to earn a King Pin T-Shirt; and \$100 and up, to participate in the Kingpin Prize Night. The Prize Night qualifiers will be sent an invitation to participate and is limited to youth bowlers only. Winners are called up, top salesman first, and so on, to pick their choice of GREAT prizes. It is **URGENT** that everyone interested in attending the next jamboree in 2013 start planning **NOW!** Get your name in now to be part of the most exciting gathering in Scouting at the Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia on **July 15-24, 2013.**

There are only two basic eligibility requirements to attend the Jamboree:

1) Scouts must be the age of 12 before leaving for the Jamboree and not have reached their 18th birthday by the last day of the Jamboree. This means that if you were born "on or before" July 12, 2001, but after July 24, 1995, you are eligible to attend.

2) Scouts must have attained the Boy Scout Rank of 1st Class prior to leaving for the Jamboree.

The Allegheny Highlands Council has only **ONE** Troop to send to the National Jamboree. That means **ONLY 36 BOYS** can attend the Jamboree. If you want to be one of them, you need to get your name in to hold your spot, then contact the Council with your reservation fee.

### The Silver Beaver Award

This coveted award is presented for outstanding service to youth and our council, and will be presented at the Council Recognition Dinner on Saturday, April 14th at the Allegany American Legion. Recipients will be selected from nominations submitted by you, and remember applications are available on our website. These nominations must be sent to the Scout Service Center by January 31, 2012. Nominations must include the following:

1. Nominee's name, address, occupation, and Scouting position that they are registered in if unit connected five the unit number.
2. When referring to BSA service, be specific, i.e. give dates, office, positions held, etc.
3. Include nominee's record of noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth within the Council territory. Non-Scouting youth service, i.e. Little League Coach, Sunday School Teacher, etc.
4. Include information detailing nominee's community standing including activities in which the nominee is most active in regarding business, professional, civic, religious, education, etc., exclusive of Scouting.

The selection committee of past recipients looks at the whole person.



### District Award of Merit

The nominee must be a registered Scouter. He/she must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, and the district. Consideration is given to the nominee's scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the natural expectations their scouting position. Service to the district is extremely important, and years of service to scouting. These awards will be presented at the council dinner. Remember; send in your nominations by January 31st to the Scout Service Center. The application to nominate someone for the District Award of Merit is on our Council website.

### Annual Council Recognition Dinner

All Scouters are cordially invited to attend the Annual Council Recognition Dinner to be held Saturday, April 14, 2011, at the Allegany American Legion (2 miles west of Allegany on Rte 417). The dinner will begin at 6:00 PM with an informal gathering starting at 5:30 PM, and should conclude around 9 PM. The dinner is open to all Scouters. You do not need to be receiving an award to attend! The cost will be \$15 a person, \$28 a couple. The dinner will be served buffet style, and is really good meal!

Each District will present their awards, including sparkplugs, VIP's, etc, and District Awards of Merit, and then the Silver Beaver Awards will be bestowed along with other key noteworthy recognitions. Reservations are required and must be received along with payment at the Scout Service Center no later than Thursday, April 5th.

### Recognizing Great Folks on this Special Occasion

Each year the Districts take time to thank and recognize its volunteers who make our district great. In addition, we would like to thank the local unit leaders, parents or supporters that are working hard for their boys and units. Check out the awards below and send your nominations in to your district by January 31st for the District Award of Merit, and two weeks before the dinner for all other awards. Thank you.

**The VIP Award** (one per unit) this person doesn't have to be a scouter, just someone who's always ready, willing, and able to help. Nominate them for VIP award.

**The Spark Plug Award** (one per unit) does your unit have a person that always seems eager and enthusiastic the *real spark* of the group. A person that is key for most things to happen and does so willingly. Nominate them for Spark Plug.

**Miscellaneous Awards** If you have some other award or thank you that you would like to do in front of the whole district and council, just let us know and we will do our best to help make that happen. Are they shy and don't want recognition? Tell them it's not for them, but to inspire others to follow their example. It's for our kids!





## Internet Rechartering

Do it at your speed, when and where is best for you.

1. You will be completing the charter renewal information yourself.
2. You can do it from your home or office anytime it is convenient for you.
3. You will also be able to update your training information and youth rank;
4. Your charter will look exactly the way you want it to.

**First** you should identify someone in your unit that is comfortable working online. Go to the council web page, [www.alleghenyhighlands.org](http://www.alleghenyhighlands.org) and click on the online rechartering link.

Before you attempt your recharter process, go through the tutorial to familiarize yourself with the process. Once familiar follow the steps below to complete your charter.

1. Click on the **Recharter Now** button below.
2. Select First-Time User and enter the unit access code provided in your recharter packet.
3. Select the unit type and enter the unit number.
4. Create a password as instructed.
5. Complete the information requested on each screen. You can stop at any time, log off by reentering your access code and password.
6. When you've completed all the information to recharter the unit, click the Submit button.
7. Print the Unit Charter Renewal Report Package, which includes the charter renewal application and lists of new members, transfers, multiples, and no-fee adults. Acquire the unit leader and chartered organization representative signatures on the applications and fee payments to the Scout Service Center before your expiration date.

The one thing that you need to remember when doing your online recharter is to mail a finished copy of the charter along with your check.

If you have any questions about the process, don't hesitate to call us.

## Internet Advancement

Internet Advancement makes it easy for unit leadership to record awards, ranks, and merit badges to you via an online process. This system is separate from Internet Rechartering, but uses a similar concept.

At any time during the year, your unit advancement person will be able to record advancements to your member records. And they'll also be able to print a unit roster at any time. The roster is the most current information from ScoutNet, and it will include the person ID for each adult and youth member.

These are other reports available from Internet Advancement.

- Unit Advancement Summary shows ranks, merit badges, and awards saved in each person's record for current members of the unit.
- Advancement Report lists each youth member that has new ranks, merit badges, and awards, if any. This is the official unit Advancement Report to be signed and submitted to the office.
- Advancement Update Summary lists the number of new ranks, merit badges, and awards by name as a shipping list.
- Advancement Update Summary lists any ranks, merit badges, and awards that were already in the member record and were updated online.

If you don't already have it, call us or email us for your unit ID number, and recruit an adult to record advancements. Ranks must be recorded based on program identification and in the correct rank and date sequence. The only rank that cannot be awarded by this process is the Eagle Scout rank.

There is also a link to the Internet Advancement Help on the site. There's a Frequently Asked Questions link on the Internet Advancement site and these should be reviewed.

After you have entered your scout's advancements, you can print out a summary sheet and fax it, mail it, call it in, or email us with your advancement badge and card order.

If you have any questions, contact the Service Center and we'll be glad to help you out.

### ***VERY IMPORTANT NOTE***

This process does not include the \$1.00 per member accident insurance, which must be submitted at the time of recharter. Please include that when submitting your fees to the Scout Service Center.

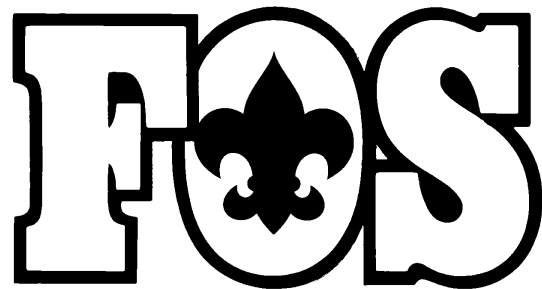

**Merit Badge Counselors**

As you may know, the national office now expires all merit badge counselors on December 31<sup>st</sup> of every year. If you wish to remain a merit badge counselor for the following year simply return your registration form that will be mailed to you every fall. We have mailed applications to everyone that we had listed, if for some reason you did not receive one please fill one out and send it in. If you want to become a merit badge counselor you will need to fill out the merit badge counselor application marking the merit badges you will counsel; if you are currently registered. If the person is not currently registered they would need to fill out an adult leader application along with the merit badge application and take the youth protection training online.
