

## **Allegheny Highlands Council Eagle Board of Review Policy**

In order to be more compliant with Eagle Board of Review policies as recommended by the National Committee we adopt the following practices.

We will hold Eagle Boards of Review at a Council level.

There will be a Board of Review night scheduled two times a month, one to be held in each district, with the date and location to be announced sufficiently ahead of the review date. Candidates may choose which one is most convenient for them to attend. Multiple Boards of Review may be held the same night.

Special Boards can be convened to meet special circumstances.

A list of willing and able BOR participants shall be compiled and kept by the Council Advancement Committee. This list shall include but not be limited to active Scouters, Scouter alumni, Eagle alumni, Council Board members, successful business people, Clergy, and members of the Advancement Committee.

Sufficient training shall be provided all BOR members to assure quality and uniformity.

A member of the candidate's unit committee, preferably the advancement chair or committee chair, will be allowed to be included.

A list of suitable locations to hold Boards of Review will be compiled by the Advancement Committee.

All reasonable attempts to expedite the process will be made.

One member of the Council Advancement Committee will be responsible to organize the processing of all Eagle Projects and Boards of Review within the Council, however it will still be a committee effort.

Projects will be approved by consensus of the Advancement Committee rather than just one member. This should encourage better uniformity of projects while still addressing special circumstances.

Unit Leaders will be encouraged to promote starting Eagle projects and requirements sooner to avoid youth aging out or just making it. The youth should have time to earn Palms and give back to the program.

The goal is to have this fully in practice by Jan 1, 2019
